WHAT IS A GED DIPLOMA?

If you are 19 and over, and you left high school without graduating, you may want to obtain your GED Diploma. A GED Diploma is the equivalency of a High School Graduation Diploma or an Adult High School Graduation Diploma.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS?

Get a Better Job

- The overwhelming majority of jobs require a high school diploma. A GED diploma is accepted by most employers—just like a high school diploma.

Increase Your Income

- Your salary will usually increase with your level of education. Getting your GED diploma may help you qualify for a better job at higher pay.

Continue Your Education

- A GED diploma is accepted at most colleges and universities across the country as proof that you have completed your high school education.

Feel Better About Yourself

- By earning a diploma, many GED graduates experience a remarkable improvement in confidence and self-esteem. Getting your GED diploma can make a big difference in your life.

Invest in the Future

- Earning a GED diploma isn't just a short-term investment in yourself. It is also an investment in your future and the future of your family.

HOW DOES THE GED PROGRAM WORK?

The GED Program is a ten-week course preparing students for the GED tests required for a GED Diploma.

- Students participate in an adult learning environment, following a schedule of classes in five main subject areas: Writing, Reading, Social Studies, Science, and Math.
- Classes run from 8:30am to 4:00pm, Monday through Friday.
- The program involves traditional classroom instruction along with opportunities to practice skills and test-taking.
- The College, situated within walking distance of downtown, offers free parking and is located on a bus route.
