<b>Title:</b>	<b>Health Requirements for Students</b>

### **GUIDING PRINCIPLE**

Certain NBCC College and Collège CCNB programs, as part of the course outcomes, require students to successfully complete practicums or work placements in community and institutional settings. The NBCC College and the Collège CCNB enter into agreements with various agencies for practicum training and is required to follow the agencies' policies and procedures and comply with all the standards and requirements prescribed by regulations.

### **POLICY STATEMENT**

Certain workplaces such as hospitals, nursing homes, day care centers and other residential facilities require that all staff, students and volunteers have a comprehensive medical examination as well as an updated immunization record. In order to protect the public, these workplaces, including food handling establishments and firms providing personal services, must also comply with legislation which prevents any person from working in these establishments while being a carrier or sick with a notifiable or contagious disease. The NBCC College and the Collège CCNB must ensure that these requirements are met prior to sending students to these workplaces.

Information on health requirements is available to students in the NBCC Calendar and Annuaire CCNB under the program's Specific Considerations section. Proof of a Medical Examination and updated Immunization Record will only be requested of students who meet admission requirements in a particular program. Once admission requirements have been met, further information will be provided in the admission information sent to accepted students on how to obtain a Medical Examination and an Immunization Record.

Students are responsible for ensuring that all health requirements are met prior to the start of practicums and work placements and to inform the instructor. Students are also

responsible to report immediately to the appropriate authorities (e.g. Public Health, Health Nurse or family physician) if they suspect or have contracted a notifiable or contagious disease. Failure to comply with this policy may result in the inability to participate in certain practicums or work placements which can delay program completion or the ability to meet graduation requirements.

All costs associated with medical examinations, tests or immunizations are the responsibility of the student.
